




Here are a few important dates you need to be aware of:







From the State Lecturer

The deadlines for the National Lecturer's contests have changed (and change again) compared to other years. This year all quilt blocks and photography entries are due by September 30.

The deadline for submitting quilt blocks has been extended to September 1. This year's quilt block is "Wonky Star." Rules and entry forms can be found at the National Grange Website, www.nationalgrange.org.

The deadline for the virtual photo contest is still June 30. Each individual can submit up to three entries. The categories are Agriculture, Sky, Trucks, and Water. All pictures must be submitted electronically prior to the deadline.

Remember to be working on your state competitions. Most of the categories from last year are still valid (including ornaments, artwork, photography, collections, and before-and-after). In addition, there is a new competition for birdhouses. Use your imagination to create an attractive and functional birdhouse.

If you are looking for inspiration, there are a number of resources on the Internet with plans and pictures of houses of varying complexity. One good starting place is this listing of 28 plans for birdhouses (https://www.thespruce.com/free-birdhouse-plans-1357100). There are also a host of ideas to be found on pinterest.com.

I also happened upon this "Storytime" clip from Mr. Ron at the Princeton Public Library. (https://fb.watch/denadHktdQ/) The theme of this episode is Houses for Birds. It might be a fun presentation for your Jr. Grangers to encourage their own building of a birdhouse.

And be sure to think about what you can contribute to our talent show. It creates a very nice program at state session when we have a few strong entries. This year's National Session is near Reno, Nevada—a distance away but certain to be a fun destination. It would be great if we had an entry to represent Illinois!

What Does it Mean to Be a Communication Fellow?

Well, I had the privilege to serve as a communication fellow for the National Session in Wichita in 2021. I just wanted to share an "insider's" view in case it might encourage you to apply.

I as one of three "official" fellows, although the communications team that I was a part of included the communication director, photographer, assistants, a number of past fellows. As described, fellows are responsible for writing content for and assembling the Patron's Chain newsletter that is produced and distributed at the end of each day.

Reasons to be a fellow:

- Contribute to a fast-paced, high energy team
- Hone your interpersonal skills in interviewing and interacting with Grangers from across the country
- Develop your writing and communication skills
- Learn more than you ever dreamed about the way the National Grange carries out its mission and implements its programs
- Form fast friendships with Grange leaders from across the country

On top of all of this, it was really a great deal of fun. We arrived a few days early at the conference site and began to work together, setting plans, and putting into place the systems that we would be using throughout the week.

Once the session began and delegates began arriving, we each had daily assignments for conducting interviews with first-time delegates, attending various banquets and reporting on speaker presentations, attending sessions and reporting on activities of the assembled body as appropriate, and writing human interest stories as uncovered. It was hectic at times making sure you were at all scheduled assignments and getting articles written, but it was always rewarding to achieve success.
