While at the Revival 3.0 I picked up information about the Affordable Connectivity Program. There was an article in the last ILLINOIS GRANGER. The information I have is available to all Granges to share with their communities. I plan on being at the Boone County Fair to distribute information. National Grange applied for a Federal Communication Commission grant to advocate for the Affordable Connectivity Program. The ACP will give internet service at reduce cost or possibly free to those having income at or below 200% of the poverty level. The National Grange has partnered with the Oregon Institute for a Better Way and Community System Navigators (Misty Burris) to put this ACP program out to the public. Please have your Grange consider the options for this program. The ACP is a two-year program. Navigators would be coming to assist with distribution of handouts and enrollment of ACP. This is one way the National Grange assists your Grange to assist your community. Please read the article and sign up. This is a good way for your Grange to help your community with letting national legislators know that your community is in need of affordable internet services.


















Legislative Report


Boone County Youth Fairboard


Don Mueller 1930-2023
