More information from National Session. I believe the checks have been sent to those who turned in hours for volunteering at National Grange Session. THANKS to EVERYONE who helped in ANYWAY. The Delegates voted on 144 resolutions, every resolution was brought to the floor for discussion/action in a different way than in the past. The Committees worked all year long to talk about the Policy Statement and work on the Present Policy. This allowed the Committee to review and compress the Policy Statement to be more of a summary of the present policy for distribution to legislators. The Delegates voted to increase the dues allocated to National Grange, and according to IL State Grange Bylaws the ISG dues will be increased as well. This was the first vote and will be necessary to pass a second vote in 2025. All members were encouraged, a number of times, to read all the information that is being sent from National Grange, and to participate in all the video calls hosted by National Grange Staff. In my experience, most families have a go to favorite of this kind. Below you will find the recipe for my family's favorite. I used to love helping my grandma make these, following the recipe from one of her many Grange cookbooks! My grandparents were at one time members of the Grange in Iowa. I hope to see your favorite No Bake Cookies in September, or make these!

Peanut Butter Cornflake Cookies

- 1 Cup Sugar
- 1 Cup Light Corn Syrup
- 2 Cups Peanut Butter
- 5 Cups Cornflakes

In a small saucepan, simmer sugar and corn syrup until mixture clears or smoothly runs off of a spoon. Place cornflakes and peanut butter in a large bowl. Pour sugar mixture into a large bowl, mix well. Using spoons, place small glob onto wax paper. Allow to set.
