Happy New Year, fellow Grangers!

As reported last month, it's time to think about Illinois State Grange scholarships. The application packets are ready and will be available on the Illinois State Grange website at illinoisstategrange.org. You can also request one by sending me an email. The application deadline is March 1, 2026. Please pass the word!

The end of the 4th Quarter was December 31.

Granges should send their Quarterly Reports and dues to me by January 15. Be sure to also include any membership changes, including new member information, as well as any contact updates or changes in officers.

Community (Subordinate) Grange dues payable to the Illinois State Grange will be increasing effective January 1, 2026. This is because of the increase in National Grange dues, which received final approval at the 2025 National Grange Convention. Per the Illinois State Grange Bylaws, state dues will increase by the same amount as the national dues. As a result, I will be sending out new Quarterly Reports with updated rates to all Community Granges, to be used beginning with the 1st Quarter ending March 31, 2026.

The increase does not affect the dues the Junior and Pomona (County) Granges pay the Illinois State Grange. How does this affect the amount Grangers pay in dues to the local Granges they belong to? Since each Community Grange sets its own dues, the Grange you belong to will decide and let you know what your dues will be.



Grange Growth Team

As part of my Internal Address, I called on each State Grange “to form a Grange Growth Team” to be responsible for identifying promising communities, organizing outreach, developing local leaders, and guiding at least one new Grange to charter in 2026. This Team exists to create momentum, expand our reach, and ensure long-term organizational vitality.

Please begin thinking about potential Team members representing a mix of:

- Membership/Leadership Development
- Communications/Outreach
- Legislative Advocacy
- Programming & Community Service
- Youth and Junior Grange
- Experience in revitalization
- At least one “connector” with strong statewide relationships

Your Grange Growth Team should be identified by January 15. Additional resources for the Grange Growth Teams will be provided in the January 1 Frontline Flash.

Performance Improvement Plans

Each State Grange President should be hearing from your National Executive Committee member soon, if you haven’t already, with the PIP assessment forms, goal worksheet, and the request to set a time to discuss and get started. The PIP process is two-pronged: the first prong is to create a PIP for each State Grange – to identify a couple of things your State Grange would like to do better; and the second prong is to identify 2-3 (or more) Community Granges in your state that you will commit to working closely with over the next year, or more, to include creating a PIP with each.

The training will take about 45-60 minutes. State Grange Presidents are welcome to attend, or to designate an authorized party to have access to maintain the records.
